A YEAR IN NUMBERS

In addition to giving felines from Eastern and Western WA a second chance, SAFe also took in cats from farther afield as travel resumed. Rescued felines included kittens from over-crowded shelters in the LA area, cats who had been stranded on the

Hawaiian islands during COVID shutdowns, and cats displaced by flooding in Louisiana.

1,438 adoptions

During the first months of the year, **433 felines** found loving homes via online, no-contact adoptions. After SAFe Rescue's Adoption Center re-opened to the public in June, **1,005 cats** met their families through in-person adoption. Congratulations to all the humans and felines who met each other in 2021!



115 volunteers

In 2021, 115 volunteers dedicated **4,070 hours** to helping cats. That's an increase of over 1,000 hours compared to 2020: it was wonderful to welcome volunteers back onsite!



180 foster homes

751 cats spent time in **180 foster homes** in 2021, for a total of 28,665 cat days. Foster homes offered cats and kittens room to grow, round-the-clock care, and lots of comfort and reassurance.

7,000 pounds

The Stay SAFe Pet Pantry continues to serve pets whose owners face economic hardship. SAFe stocked the pantry with over **7,000 pounds** of cat and dog food

in 2021, and donations from our community added more food, too!

A MESSAGE FROM SAFE'S EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR

In 2021, after 14 months of contact-free adoptions, SAFe welcomed the public back to the Adoption Center! It is heartwarming to witness adopters meet their new family members, and energizing to have the public back. We hope that 2022 will bring a full year of in-person adoptions and a return to full intake capacity. With so many homeless cats in need, and so many kind cat lovers in our area, adoptions continue to be the heart of SAFe.

Operating amid the quicksand of ever-changing pandemic restrictions and precautions has taken a lasting toll, but your support has been not just a bridge to solid ground, it has enabled SAFe to continue to grow.

Community is an important SAFe value that is key to our future. Before expanding support programs, we wanted to hear directly from the community, so we hired Anna-Rebecca Lopez, a SAFe Adopter and evaluator specializing in community-centric engagement to survey more than 450 people about SAFe's work!

We were honored to hear that so many of you think highly of SAFe. It warmed my heart to read responses such as "The SAFe team works with each cat to help them find their confidence and personalities by providing a safe and comfortable place to be, socializing, and even training cats." and "A well-organized and supportive, heart-centered organization."

While people think SAFe is doing many things well, there is opportunity for us to do even more to meet community needs and develop relationships with groups who have yet to engage with SAFe. Here are the main recommendations:

- **EXPAND OUTREACH** efforts to build awareness with more people.
- **BUILD CAPACITY** to provide more support for fosters and volunteers, as well as additional post-adoption support.
- **OFFER A VARIETY** of services and programs, including behavior and wellness education and low cost veterinary care for income-qualified individuals.
- GROW the physical footprint to help more cats and expand services as the organization grows.
- **REPRESENT THE COMMUNITY**, increase inclusivity, and work with community groups to engage more authentically in meaningful and long-term ways.

We are so thankful for your input and are excited to embrace these challenges. In fact, these recommendations are directly reflected in our planning! The new 2022-2024 Strategic Plan focuses on 3 key initiatives. (See inset.) We're excited to share more with you about how your support is turning these initiatives into programs with a direct impact on cats and people. All of us at SAFe are grateful that you are on this journey with us!


