## **Letter from Emily** | Executive Director, SAFe Rescue

# **2023** was a year of exciting growth and change at SAFe Rescue!

The move to a larger facility has transformed our work, allowing us to take on new challenges, build community in new ways, and save even more lives.

**SAFe's new home would not have been possible without our amazing community.** More than 500 supporters
contributed to the Capital Campaign. A
team of more than 75 staff and volunteers
packed and moved our entire operation
in a mere 10 days. Meanwhile, our foster
community stepped up to house all
the cats offsite during the closure. This
incredible work let us welcome more than
100 community members to a Ribbon
Cutting celebration in July.

Then, we went right back to work. **Just 12** days after closing our old location, we were open for adoptions!

Thanks to your support, we can now help cats in need in new ways. Our new medical area includes a surgical suite, imaging room and ICU. This enables our medical team to provide more specialized care and take in cases we previously could not.

With our new space, we can also embrace larger groups of volunteers and fosters. Our community support programs continue to grow, providing much needed help for pet families in need.

As we celebrate the life-saving work we have accomplished together, we are excited for the potential for even greater impact in the years to come.

## 2023 in Numbers

#### Intake

Of the 1,707 incoming cats we had in 2023, 1,338 came from Washington.

#### **Foster Homes**

Not every kitty is ready for adoption right away. From tiny kittens too young for vaccines to injured felines on the mend, SAFe's 125 fearless foster families opened up their homes to 1,100 cats in 2023. That's 396 more meowers than the year before!

#### Pet Pantry + Community Clinics

Now at three years old, our Pet Pantry program has expanded to provide **over 6,500 meals per month.** Meanwhile, **119 cats** received low-cost services through our **monthly Community Clinics.** 

#### Spay + Neuter

Our terrific medical team performed **663 spay and neuter surgeries** in 2023. Plus, our new facility allows us to take more complex medical cases.

#### **Volunteers**

A total of 123 volunteers helped keep SAFe Rescue residents clean, fed, and cared for on their way to adoption. Altogether, these committed cat lovers dedicated 8,129 hours to our kitties, an increase of over 10% from 2022!





The total cost of the project came to \$1,053,280. In 2023, SAFe spent \$920,462 on the expansion. Of these costs, \$908,347 were capitalized. The remaining \$12,114 were included in program expenses.


## How you made it happen!

In 2023, SAFe received \$260,899 in restricted gifts to the capital campaign, as well as \$68,400 in grants for equipment for the new facility.

This was in addition to the \$302,742 raised in 2022.

A \$269,471 tenant improvement allowance credit was received in early 2024 and is not reflected in our 2023 financials.

The remaining \$151,768 was paid for with reserve funds.



#### **Bigger Impact** Big Move ∣

In July 2023, after over three years of planning, we packed up the Aurora Avenue location and hit the road for SAFe's new home in Ballinger Village.

With double the square **footage** of our previous building, the new location offers increased capacity and wider spaces for the transport, housing, and

care of cats. More room for support services like an expanded Pet Pantry and designated spaces for adopter conversations ensure comfort for both felines and humans!

#### Community **Support**

**Brigid** arrived at SAFe with a spinal and tail injury. Medication, foster care and even regular acupuncture helped her feel so much better!

At first, Bennie seemed like a medical mystery. Eventually, tests and radiographs revealed a chronic upper respiratory infection. Antibiotics and antivirals help to manage Bennie's symptoms so he can resume his zoomies!







Her leg wasn't healing, so the medical team safely amputated it. After her surgery, Lucy found a new home and a fresh start.

#### **Medical Suite**

Our expanded medical suite, including a dedicated surgery area, exam rooms, an ICU, imaging room, and ringworm ward is one of the highlights of SAFe's new facility!

Separate exam rooms mean that cats can be seen in a quiet, enclosed space, and an imaging room allows the Medical Team to perform radiographs in-house.

Even small details matter, like special glass-fronted cupboards for the pharmacy area so lifesaving medications can be quickly and easily dispensed.

#### **Adoptions Program**

Our new Adoption Center is more comfortable and inclusive for adopters. Quiet spaces to interact with cats and fill out paperwork improves the experience for humans and felines alike. We've also been able to support training for more Adoption Counseling volunteers!

#### **Intake Program**

Having more enclosures helps our Intake Department plan for new cat arrivals, and allows more space for cats who need it! Wider hallways and separate spaces for different feline populations help ensure feline health and lowers stress.
